About Our Artistic Director

Jason Stephens is a graduate from Lamar University in Beaumont, Texas, where he received a Bachelor of Music in 2003. He studied Conducting with Travis Almany and Dr. Barry Johnson and attended a Conducting Symposium under the direction of Craig Kirchhoff. After moving to Houston, he joined the Houston Pride Band as a bassoonist in 2005. He was named Interim Artistic Director in early 2006 and appointed as permanent Artistic Director in November 2006.

Jason works for the Houston Public Library and plans to pursue his Masters degree in Library Sciences from the University of North Texas. He is also the music librarian for the River Oaks Chamber Orchestra and occasionally substitutes in with the Houston Civic Symphony.



Program Notes



Rollo Takes a Walk

Born in Massachusetts, David Maslanka (b. 1943) is a highly acclaimed composer who is best known for his compositions for wind ensemble. Maslanka's compositional style can be rhythmically intense and complex, yet possessing a

warm spiritual quality and underlying delicate beauty.

Rollo is a fictional character created by Charles Ives and used in his musical writings to illustrate ultra-conservative musical tastes (typically something too-of-ten played or boring.) Among the types of music Rollo doesn't like are, ironically, Ives' own works and modern music in general. In Rollo Takes a Walk, Maslanka takes Rollo on a musical outing for a gentle parody of concerts in the park and of some bands (whose tuning may be less than perfect.) The piece is not intended as a jab at wind bands, but rather as an exploration of the "out-of-tune" or "microtonal character that is viewed as a forceful, original element in American music.

Amazing Grace

A native of Louisiana, Frank Ticheli (b. 1958) is an American composer, most notably of numerous compositions that have become standards in the concert band repertoire. He has been the recipient of multiple awards, grants and commissions and is currently a Professor of Composition at the University of Southern California.

Ticheli's Amazing Grace is based on the well-known spiritual by the same name. Ticheli states: "The spiritual Amazing Grace was written by John Newton (1725-1807), a slaveship captain who, after years of transporting slaves across the Atlantic Ocean to the New World, suddenly saw through divine grace the evilness of his acts."

Ukrainian Folk Songs

Halsey Stevens (1908-1989) was born in New York and is recognized as an important American composer, teacher and writer on the subject of music. He was a fruitful composer and also authored a biography that is a standard on the life and music of Bela Bartok. William Schaefer (b. 1918) is a prolific arranger, scoring many major orchestral works for band and making modern editions of many old works for wind bands. Both Schaefer and Stevens taught extensively at the University of Southern California. Ukrainian Folk Songs was arranged from a collection of piano pieces originally written as teaching pieces for Stevens's children. Each of the eleven folk songs is set so as to reflect the character inherent in each piece. Skillfully arranged, Ukrainian Folk Songs uses only the instruments and textures needed to create a sonority unique to each individual movement.

Concertino, Op. 26

Carl Maria von Weber (1786-1826) was a German composer who became one of the first significant composers of the Romantic period. His musical inspiration reached wide – influencing orchestration, opera, choral, vocal and instrumental music as well as the likes of Chopin, Liszt, Wagner, Mahler, Stravinsky, Debussy and Hindemith. His cousin Constanze was the wife of Mozart.

In the late 18th century, the clarinet was just beginning to gain acceptance into orchestras (largely due to Mozart's love of its sound). Inspired by his friend and virtuosic clarinetist Heinrich Bärmann, Weber wrote the Concertino, Op. 26 in just two weeks for an 1811 Munich concert for King Maximillian I. Written in one movement, the piece expanded the technical possibilities offered by the then ten-key clarinet and was so well received that not only did the King order two full-scale clarinet concertos, but the whole orchestra began requesting concertos from Weber. The band arrangement was completed by renowned band composer, Alfred Reed.

West Side Story Selection

Leonard Bernstein (1918-1990) is arguably the most well-known American composer and conductor to date and one of the most famous gay musicians of all time. He was widely known for his conducting of the New York Philharmonic and his Young People's Concerts series.

West Side Story was a collaboration of Bernstein, lyricist Stephen Sondheim and choreographer Jerome Robbins and fused the best operatic elements with the energy of Broadway. It premiered in 1957 and was an immediate success and has since become an unforgettable work of art for the stage. The story is a then-modern treatment of the greatest of all love stories, Romeo and Juliet. West Side Story Selection was arranged by W.J. Duthoit and features some of the most memorable songs, including: I Feel Pretty; Maria; Something's Caming; Tonight; One Hand, One Heart: Cool and America.
