



Program Notes

Leonard Bernstein (1918-1990) is probably the most famous American born conductor and composer. His long tenure with the New York Philharmonic, advocacy of classical music with his Young Peoples' Concerts, and multiple compositions proved to be a winning combination with people all over the world. Although his adaptation of Voltaire's Candide would prove to be one of his most successful works for the musical stage (along with On the Town and West Side Story), it actually ran fewer than eighty performances when it opened on Broadway in December 1956. The Overture to 'Candide' incorporates several of the main themes of the songs found in Candide and has become a favorite of American audiences ever since.

"Begin the Beguine" is a famous song written by Cole Porter (1891-1946) and introduced in the Broadway musical Jubilee. A beguine is a spirited ballroom dance and this song is indicative of Porter's artistic style and poetic ability. Porter was known for his musical comedies such as Kiss Me, Kate and Anything Goes and other songs such as "Night and Day" and "I Get a Kick Out of You." With his sophisticated lyrics and clever rhymes, Porter is probably the most prolific single contributor to the Great American Songbook.

Percy Grainger (1882-1961) was an Australian composer and pianist who, along with Gustav Holst and Ralph Vaughan Williams, helped pave the way for the wind band and its repertoire. His talent as a child earned him the opportunity to study in Europe, where he became an eccentric expert in the collection of folk songs of the British Isles. *Irish Tune from County Derry* originates from the famous Irish folk song "O Danny Boy" and features Grainger's love of counterpoint and technique of burying the melody occasionally within the texture of the music.

The Second Suite in F was one of the first works in the repertoire of compositions specifically for wind band. Written by Gustav Holst (1874-1934), Second Suite in F is based entirely on material from folk songs and morris dances. Holst earned a living as a professional trombonist in addition to composing and teaching. His use of folk materials can be attributed to his rediscovery of English folk songs during a time between the two World Wars when Nationalism in music flourished. His concern for clarity and directness of expression in music was also influenced by his study of Eastern philosophy.

Born in Barcelona, Jaime Texidor Dalmau (1885-1957) was a composer, conductor, and publisher who lived most of his life in Baracaldo, a city in northern Spain. Reputed to be a saxophonist in a military band, Texidor served as the second conductor of the Baracaldo Municipal Band from 1927 until 1936. He wrote *Amparito Roca*, a paso doble or Spanish two-step folk dance, and dedicated it to a girl with the same name who lived in the area.

Most well-known for his *Pomp and Circumstance Marches*, Sir Edward Elgar (1857-1934) was a self-taught musician and English Romantic composer. *Nimrod* is the ninth and most often performed variation of his famous *Enigma Variations*, where each variation represented a different friend. It pays tribute to his close friend, A.J. Jaeger and the name Nimrod refers to an Old Testament patriarch described as a mighty hunter (the name Jaeger being German for *hunter*.) It is said that this variation depicts a night-time walk the two had, during which they discussed Beethoven's *Piano Sonata No.* 8 "*Pathetique*".

Jupiter, the Bringer of Jollity is the fourth movement of The Planets, an orchestral suite by Gustav Holst depicting the astrological (not astronomical) association of the planets of our solar system. Holst's interest Hindu mysticism and spirituality is evident in his elaborate scoring of The Planets, imaginative, colorful orchestration and unusual and complex instrumentation. Holst meant for Jupiter to be buoyant, hopeful and joyous. It begins like a genial, syncopated dance. The middle section is a lush chorale which eventually became the setting for the hymn I vow to thee my country. The frivolity of the games soon returns in a grand finish.




