



## Program Notes

Johann Strauss Jr. (1825—1899), better know as the "Waltz King," helped promote the waltz from a peasant dance to entertainment for royalty. He came from a very musical family—his father and brothers were all composers. Some of his best known works are the *Emperor Waltz* and the *Blue Danube Waltz*.


Die Fledermaus (translated as "the Bat") is his most famous operetta and one of the most famous of all time. Premiered in 1874, it tells of a Baron who gets his comeuppance from his best friend, Falke. The previous year, the Baron played a trick on him which had made him the laughing-stock of the city when he had been attending a carnival in the disguise of a bat. He was stuck with the nickname "The Bat" and now hopes to get the Baron into hot water with his wife at a costume ball. The hysterics ensue and, as comic operetta's go, everything ends happily.

Frank Ticheli (b. 1958) is one of the best known composers in the concert band repertoire. Last year, members of the Houston Pride Band attended the LGBA conference in Palm Springs where Mr. Ticheli was the guest clinician.

In the composer's own words, *Abracadabra* is dedicated to his son, and is at once playful and serious, innocent and mischievous. Throughout the composition, Ticheli thought about magic as a source of fun and fantasy as well as images of Halloween with its costumes and jack-o'-lanterns. As the piece nears its conclusion, the music rushes toward what seems to be an explosive finish. But the woodwinds interrupt, fanning out to a questioning whole-tone cluster. They are answered by a puff of sound, a final disappearing act.

Nobou Uematsu (b. 1959) is a Japanese composer of video game music, most notably, much of the Final Fantasy series. He was named as one of the "Innovators" in *Time Magazine*'s "Time 100: The Next Wave—Music" feature. He is an acclaimed composer who has been touted as increasing the appreciation and awareness of video game music.

The video game *Final Fantasy VII* has sold more than 9.72 million copies, making it the best selling *Final Fantasy* title. The game's story centers on a group of adventurers as they battle a powerful mega-corporation which is draining the life of the planet to use as an energy source. As the story progresses, conflicts escalate and the world's safety becomes a major concern. *One Winged Angel* is the music that plays



during the final battle to save the planet. The lyrics to the original version came from the same Latin poetry featured in Carl Orff's Carmina Burana.

Camille Saint-Saëns (1835—1921) was one of the most talented musical child prodigies of all time. He began piano lessons at age 2, wrote his first composition at age 3, and his first public recital at age 10. As an encore to this recital, he offered to play any one of Beethoven's 32 piano sonatas, from memory. He was very versatile, studying everything from archaeology to astronomy and wrote poetry and on philosophical ideas. He was friend and enemy of many of his contemporaries—allying with Liszt and Wagner and despising Debussy and Stravinsky.

First performed in 1874, Danse Macabre is a symphonic poem based on a poem by Henri Cazalis. According to the ancient superstition, "Death" appears at midnight every year on Halloween. Death has the power to call forth the dead from their graves to dance for him while he plays his fiddle. His skeletons dance for him until the first break of dawn, when they must return to their graves until the next year.

Eric Whitacre (b. 1970) is an American composer of choral and wind band music. He has composed a multitude of works and is one of the most recognized composers in America today.

In the composer's own words, "October is my favorite time of year. Something about the crisp autumn air and the subtle change in light always makes me a little sentimental, and as I started to sketch, I felt that same quiet beauty in the writing. The style was also perfectly suited to capture the natural and pastoral soul of the season."


Carl Orff (1895—1982) was a major composer of the 20<sup>th</sup> century and successful and influential in the field of music education. His *Schulwerk* (Music for Children) teaches simple musical instrumentation allowing even untutored child musicians to perform music with relative ease. His best known work is *Carmina Burana* and was first performed in 1937.

Carmina Burana is a scenic cantata collecting 24 poems from a collection of medieval poetry. The libretto includes both Latin and German verse and covers a wide range of secular topics. The band arrangement collects 13 of the movements and incorporates the vocal parts into the arrangement. The work begins and ends depicting the crushing anguish of the victims of Fortune's ruthless wheel. In between, are songs of earthly pleasure, joys of spring and nature, pleasures of drinking and gambling, the delights of love, and the irony of Fate.





Marisol "Sol" Lara and members of AssistHers have partnered with the Houston Pride Band for fundraising events this year. For tonight's concert performance, AssistHers received half of the proceeds

from tickets sold by their organization. We are very proud and honored to share a working partnership with AssistHers ... a relationship that has been rewarding on both fundraising and personal levels.

AssistHers is a volunteer organization formed in 1996 to provide non-medical in-home support and care to lesbians with illnesses such as cancer, fibromyalgia, HIV/AIDS and multiple sclerosis. Volunteers work together to provide transportation and care to help clients remain in their own homes.

Sol notes that half of AssistHers' clients live alone while the other half has friends or partners who are struggling as caregivers and providers. AssistHers provides support and friendship their clients as well as their partners, caregivers, children and other family members.

AssistHers is a lesbian-based organization which uses the Care Team model, provides ongoing healthrelated education to its volunteers, and assists clients affected by illnesses.
